Concert Attendance Policy

Performing for people is the reason the band exists! **Attendance at required concerts is mandatory** and a large portion of the class grade (see syllabus for grade breakdown.) Please note that during the 7th/8th grade band concerts, students must stay for the entire concert. Absence will only be excused for the same reasons that SCS excuses absences from school. If you think that you will be absent, please contact the directors as soon as possible! If the absence is excused, a makeup assignment will be given; if the absence is unexcused, no makeup assignment will be provided.

Instrument Repair – If you own your instrument, we recommend sending it to Shen-Valley for repair. You can either take the instrument to their Harrisonburg store for repair or students can leave it in the repair box in the Band Room and Shen-Valley will pick it up on Tuesdays.

If you rent your instrument through Shen-Valley, you can either take it to their Harrisonburg store for repair or they can leave it in the repair box in the Shelburne band room and Shen-Valley will pick it up on Tuesdays.

If you rent your instrument through Music and Arts, they can pick up by request at Shelburne or you can take it to the Heifetz storefront on Beverly street.

Note: Shen-Valley is very fast (most repairs take a week) however it should be noted that due to the volume of repairs that they do, they can't call every single person that sends in an instrument before they repair it. Their policy is that if you send them an instrument and the repair is less than 50 dollars, they will go ahead and do it, then bill you for it. If the repair is more than 50 dollars, they will call you before doing anything.

Classwork & Daily Class Grade

Band is a team activity; we succeed as a group, not as individuals. As such, students' full participation in every activity in rehearsals is critical to the success of the group. Students will receive a 10-point **Daily Class Grade** for participation in rehearsal (5 points), having all required materials (3 points), and being ready on time (2 points). Additionally, any activities we complete in class will fall in the **Classwork** category.

Assessments

All assessments are opportunities for students to demonstrate mastery of a targeted skill, and will take different forms depending on the skill being assessed. One assessment may be recording a video of playing something specific, or a written or digital test, or playing in person during class. Students are allowed to retake assessments as many times as they want before the grading period is over. We want every student to have the chance to get better. However, if a student doesn't practice the material and asks to retake it, we will tell them they cannot try again until they spend time practicing it.

Concert Attendance

6th Grade Band Students have two required performances: the Winter Concert and Spring Concert. Please reference the calendar on page 1 for specific dates, times, and locations. Absence will only be excused for the same reasons that SCS excuses absences from school. If you think that you will be absent, please contact the directors as soon as possible! If the absence is excused, a makeup assignment will be given. If the absence is unexcused, no makeup assignment will be provided.

Homework

Specific homework will not be assigned, however students are expected to practice at home to prepare for their playing tests and upcoming performances. It is recommended that students practice playing in front of their family to prepare for the "nervous feeling" that typically comes with a playing test!

Class Procedure

Class Procedure

- 1. Get your Instrument + Binder then go to your seat
- 2. Assemble your instrument.
- 3. When the timer is zero, stand up with your instrument laying in your chair. Clarinet, Sax, and Double Reed players must have their reeds on the instrument by this time. If you're not done assembling your instrument, you will be marked tardy!
